Dear Chairman Oberstar:

The State of Wyoming is pleased to provide certifications and transparency and accountability information on the following transportation and infrastructure formula programs funded under the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act:

Federal Highway Administration, Highway Infrastructure Investments;
Federal Transit Administration, Transit Capital Assistance; and
Clean Water State Revolving Funds (CWSRF) under Title VI of the Federal Water Pollution Control Act.

This submittal contains copies of Sections 1201, 1511, and 1607 certifications and transparency and accountability tables for the above covered programs.

Please note that the information reported in the transparency and accountability tables as of March 31, 2009, represents an incomplete view of Wyoming's efforts. For example, Wyoming's State Loan and Investment Board, which I chair, will meet in May and June to award applications and obligate Wyoming's allotment of CWSRF funds. Highway infrastructure funds obligated as of March 31, 2009, account for only about 17 percent of Wyoming's highway funds, whereas, within 120 days of enactment, Wyoming is on schedule to obligate 100 percent of its highway funds. Transit Capital Assistance funding also is on schedule for full obligation within the 180 day time frame.

We truly appreciate your leadership and committee efforts in developing the infrastructure portion of the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act. I pledge my support to ensure that your goal that these funds are invested quickly, efficiently, and in harmony with the job creation purposes of this Act are accomplished in Wyoming.
